**STEP 1** – Look at: [Arts Award info](#)

For Arts Award Discover you need to:

A: **Take part in at least one arts activity.** This could be writing a story, drawing a picture, making some music, singing a song, dancing a dance – or anything else creative that you enjoy or would like to try for the first time.

B: **Find out about an artist.** You can find out about anyone who does a creative job, like a singer, painter, playwright, actor, writer or musician. Do you know anyone who is creative you could find out about?

C: **Share what you have enjoyed and learnt with at least one other person.** You could show your family what you have done, or share with family and friends over video call, email, or phone.
